

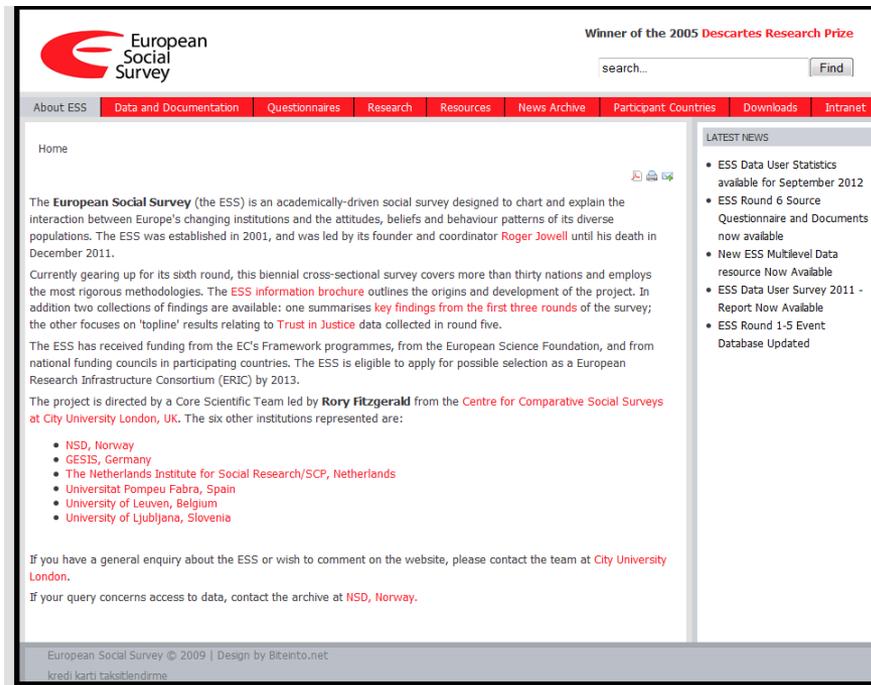

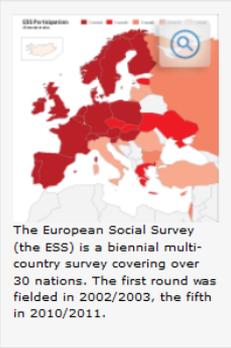

## ESS DATA

**The European Social Survey**  
The European Social Survey (the ESS) is a biennial multi-country survey covering over 30 nations. The first round was fielded in 2002/2003, the fifth in 2010/2011.

The project is funded jointly by the European Commission, the European Science Foundation and academic funding bodies in each participating country, and is designed and carried out to exceptionally high standards. The project is directed by a Core Scientific Team led by Rory Fitzgerald at the Centre for Comparative Social Surveys, City University, London.



The European Social Survey (the ESS) is a biennial multi-country survey covering over 30 nations. The first round was fielded in 2002/2003, the fifth in 2010/2011.

**The questionnaire**  
The questionnaire includes two main sections, each consisting of approximately 120 items; a 'core' module which remains relatively constant from round to round, plus two or more 'rotating' modules, repeated at intervals. The core module aims to monitor change and continuity in a wide range of social variables, including media use; social and public trust; political interest and participation; socio-political orientations; governance and efficacy; moral; political and social values; social exclusion, national, ethnic and religious allegiances; well-being; health and security; human values; demographics and socio-economics.

**Methodological data**  
The ESS collects a wide range of methodological data, including tests of reliability, call records, data on interview settings and event data.

**Access to data**  
The data are available free of charge and without restrictions, for not-for-profit purposes. To access data files, you have to register as an ESS data user. If already registered, log in with your registered e-mail address as username. You don't have to log in to get access to the documentation files.

**ESS4 Austrian data released**  
The Austrian data for ESS round 4 was released 28.09.12. The release also includes Austrian interviewer and parents' occupation data. All data files are accessible under country files on the [ESS4 - 2008 Data Download page](#). (28/09/12)

**ESS Multilevel Data launched**  
The ESS Multilevel Data resource, partly funded by the [Descartes Research Prize](#) awarded the ESS, was launched on 18th of September.  
The ESS MD is a resource that contains data about individuals (the ESS respondents), regions and countries, and incorporates contextual variables on a number of themes, including demography, geography, economy, health, education and crime. (18/09/12)

**ESS5 First edition (1.0) of test data**  
The first edition of test data (edition 1.0) from supplementary questionnaire for ESS round 5 was released on September 3rd, 2012.

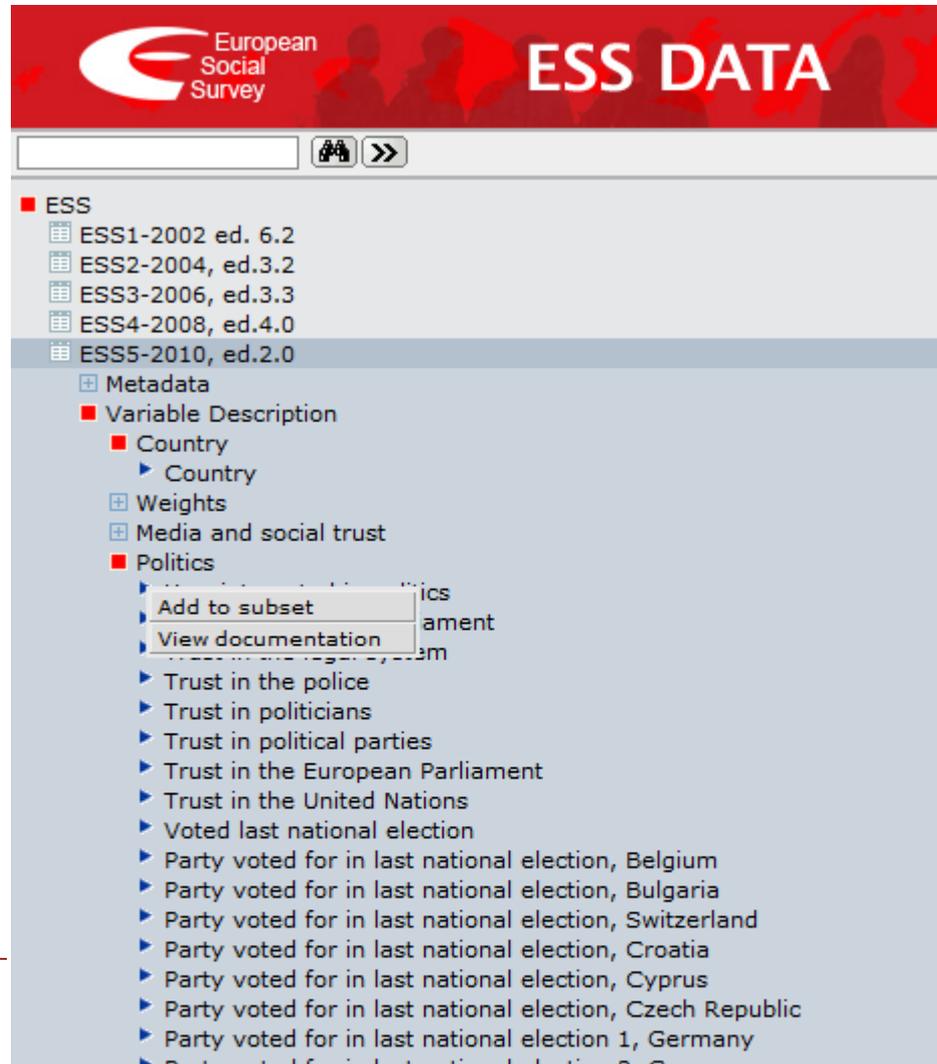
